Questions for personal reflection and/or group discussion

Session 1, Chapter 1: Sharing Christ

- Q 1. Do you view yourself more as a servant of Christ or as a saint in Christ? (1:1)
- Q 2. When do you find it easiest to Share Christ with others? (1:18)
- Q 3. In what ways do you identify with Paul's words in 1:21: 'For me to live is Christ, and to die is gain'?
- Q 4. Share one of the main ways in which you live for Christ?

Session 2, Chapter 2, Serving Like Christ

- Q 5. Briefly consider the different attitudes of Adam and Christ (v6). In what ways do you see people grasping at equality with God today?
- Q 6. How significant is humility and servanthood as we hold out the word of life (v16)? Does this put limitations on how we share the faith if a more outgoing approach may be attractive to some people?
- Q 7. In what ways does following the example of Christ 'becoming nothing' (v7) affect, or even undermine, our sense of worth as Children of God?
- Q 8. Epaphroditus had the role of caring for the needs of Paul (v25). Can we avoid our sense of worth being dependent upon serving others?

Session 3, Chapter 3, Surrender to Christ

- Q 8. What things may you need to hold more lightly to so that you can deepen your relationship with God? (3:8)
- Q 10. Discuss what the phrase 'the surpassing greatness of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord' means to you? (3:7)
- Q 11. In what ways has 'the fellowship of sharing in his sufferings', enabled you to experience resurrection power? (3:10)
- Q 12. What does 'our citizenship is in heaven' mean to you? (3:20)

Session 4, Chapter 4, Strength From Christ

- Q 13. What does it mean to you to 'Stand firm in the Lord' (v 1)?
- Q 14. Can it be realistic to 'be content in any and every situation' (v12)? How?
- Q 15. Discuss how you receive strength from Christ?
- Q 16. Do we shine for Christ through who we are or by what we do?
